

Roadsworth



However, his art is also socially engaged, as is emphasised by his collaborations with Greenpeace and Amnesty International.

Defund The War Machine, 2022

Defund the War Machine is a condemnation of the war profits of the global military industrial complex that fuels conflict and human suffering and blurs the line between defensive necessity and capitalist imperative. For Roadsworth, the work of art is a call to redirect billions in military budgets to the urgent need to address the climate crisis and other challenges that face humanity. This aspiration is embodied by the Völklingen Ironworks itself, which was involved in military production at various points in its history but after its closure was rededicated as a place of culture and reflection.

Implementation period: 1 to 6 April 2022



Maxime Drouet

Maxime Drouet, who is known for his elaborate artistic treatment of train windows, is installing a complete wagon in an exhibition hall for the first time ever. The abstract version of a whole train, complete with artistically processed train windows and doors, is to be recreated in the 1,000-squaremetre Ore Hall – the former French railway train will become a complete work of art!

Place

City of Völklingen, façade of the Saarstahl building of the former continuous casting plant at the station underpass Kaya Urhan is one of the many steelworkers with Turkish roots. His portrait on the façade of the Saarstahl building on Rathausstraße lies at the interface between the city centre and the Völklingen Ironworks industrial monument. Hendrik Beikirch's work of art makes an important and at the same time emotional contribution to the cultural history of the Völklingen Ironworks, and also acts as a link between the World Cultural Heritage Site where Kaya Urhan once worked and the city of Völklingen, where he lives today.

Implementation period 11 to 15 April 2022

Katre

The Völklingen Ironworks' investments were handled by its own Röchling Bank, amongst others. From 1955, this branch of the bank and the Ironworks' casino were housed in the administration building on Völklingen's Rathausstraße. Famous personalities once went in and out here, and the safe with the money was stored in the basement. Today the building is empty, slumbering in a deep sleep. So who would be better to awaken this historically significant space with a kiss than Katre? The French artist has a passion for industrial culture and "lost places" — abandoned factories and industrial wastelands. They are his favourite places for his art. He and various other artists play with the indoor and outdoor spaces of the former Röchling Bank.

City of Völklingen, underpass to the station

Rero

One thing stands out in Rero's work, namely that his messages — written in the same Verdana font without any flourishes— are always crossed out. An unmistakeable style and a statement: every statement also contains its opposite. Hello World or HELL—O—WORLD? It depends on the viewer's perspective. Current events clearly illustrate just how quickly the world can become hell.
